Dear Morse Athletics Families,

Thank you for supporting your child's participation in athletics at Morse High School. We are fortunate to have an outstanding coaching staff. Many of our coaches have deep ties to the Morse community and have served our students and families for many years.

Our goal is to mentor, teach, and encourage each student-athlete while reinforcing hard work, discipline, teamwork, responsibility, fairness, respect, and trustworthiness. Morse is a special school community, and we appreciate your partnership as we help our students grow into successful young people both in the classroom and in athletics. The following information was discussed at our parent meeting and will serve as a resource for you to support your student-athlete this year.

Academic Expectations

- **Eligibility:** Maintain at least a 2.0 GPA in scholarship and satisfactory citizenship grades.
- Encourage your student to attend after-school tutoring and all team study halls.
- Coaches will conduct periodic **Grade Checks** and follow the published **Eligibility/Ineligibility Dates**.
- Monitor grades, citizenship, attendance, and team communications; contact teachers, counselors, or coaches early when concerns arise.

Loss of Privileges (LOP)

The LOP list is published at the end of each grading period. A student may be placed on the list for one or more of the following:

- **Grades:** Below a 2.0 GPA in scholarship and/or citizenship during a previous grading period.
- **Behavior:** A formal suspension during the current grading period.
- **Attendance:** A cumulative combination of 12 unexcused or unverified period absences and/or tardies.

Students on the LOP list WILL lose access to games, dances, senior activities, and other school events.

Represent Morse with Pride

- Student-athletes represent themselves, their families, their teams, Morse High School, and San Diego Unified School District.
- Students and families must demonstrate respectful conduct, good sportsmanship, responsible social-media use, and respect for coaches, officials, opponents, and spectators.
- Cheer positively—please do not coach from the stands or confront officials.



Athletic Clearance & Transportation

- Complete all athletic-clearance requirements, including a current physical and updated emergency information, before participation.
- Every student traveling to games by private vehicle must have a completed one-day/seasonal activity form on file, including the top student-participation section.
- If your student may ride with another approved adult, complete the [student-rider approval section](#).
- Parents who want to drive students must complete the [Authorization for Personal Car Trips](#), the “Authorization of Private Vehicles” section, and the designated driver-approval section.
- Submit a copy of all completed private-transportation forms to AP Lincoln for the Main Office. Students may ride only with properly approved drivers.

Support Morse Athletics

- Support team and schoolwide fundraising. Funds help provide equipment, uniforms, transportation, team activities, and additional student opportunities.
- Join the Morse Booster Club, volunteer when possible, and participate in Booster Club events and fundraising efforts.
- Help students arrive on time for school, practices, meetings, and competitions, and follow team procedures for communication and pickup.
